Course Overview

Journalism is an exciting mix of practical and theoretical modules in print, online, social media, radio and television. You get real-time experience of the work of a journalist in top-class media facilities including a digital newsroom, Ultra High Definition 4K TV studio and our own radio station.

We cover issues such as fake news and the relationship between power and the media, and encourage critical thinking about the role of the media in contemporary society. This four-year course will prepare you for a career in the media, and includes a professional work placement in third year and the opportunity to study abroad.

Course Outline

Year One

In Year One you study Journalism along with two other Arts subjects. Journalism modules may include:

Year Two

In Year Two you study Journalism along with one other Arts subject. Journalism modules may include:

- Reporting and Writing
- Broadcast Journalism
- Power without Responsibility

You choose between either

 Features and Magazines or Sports Journalism

You will be supported to prepare for Third Year work placement.

Year Three

You choose between four options including a full-year work placement or one semester of work placement and one semester of Erasmus/Study Abroad (subject to availability).

Year Four

In Year Four you study Journalism along with one other Arts subject. Journalism modules may include:

- The Contemporary Irish Media: Policy, Politics and Practice since 1922
- Global Political Economy of the Mass Media
- Digital Newsdays
